Power of Attorney

A Power of Attorney allows you to choose one or more trusted persons to make financial and legal decisions on your behalf.

You can specify what your attorney can do, for example...

- access your bank accounts
- sell your real estate
- pay your bills
- sign contracts and agreements
- deal with Centrelink, Medicare and other government agencies.

You can also specify when your attorney can act, for example...

- immediately
- only if you become mentally incapacitated
- for a set period of time.

Your next of kin cannot make these decisions for you unless...

- you have appointed them in your Enduring Power of Attorney, or
- they have been appointed by the NSW Civil & Administrative Tribunal

Enduring Guardianship

When it comes to decisions, such as:

- where you live
- the type of care you receive
- and to a limited degree, what medical treatment you receive

we recommend an Appointment of an Enduring Guardian.

Increasingly, hospital and nursing staff will ask to see an Enduring Guardian document when discussing medical treatment with family members.
